Top 10 Extended Enterprise LMS Features: The No-Fluff Guide

There's a lot riding on choosing the right learning management system (LMS) for extended enterprise. The right platform significantly impacts training effectiveness, learner engagement, and overall organizational and revenue growth. 1. Multi-Persona Functionality

Developing the skills of every person in your business ecosystem means you need an LMS that's flexible enough to serve the needs of all your different users at once. Whether it's training up new partners or giving each franchisee the right branded experience, your LMS should make everything from content to administrative tasks a breeze.

What to Look For

- The ability to train and serve multiple audiences simultaneously by providing unique interfaces and training programs for as many learning groups as you'd like, whether it's multiple subsidiaries under a parent company, training partners, customers, and employees, or supporting regional needs.
- Configurable partner or franchise portals with unique branding and site URL (including its own SSL certificate), all within the same instance of the LMS.
- Advanced eCommerce functionality and reporting capabilities so you can take advantage of training as a revenue stream. Bonus points if it works on mobile too!
- International, multi-currency management based on geography and multiple currencies to aggregate global L&D finances and training investments.
- Multiple options for monetisation for the same customer, such as subscriptions, coupons, licenses to sell, differentiated pricing, and more.



2. Granular Controls

Learning management gets complex when you have many varied users or even the same learner completing different kinds of courses, such as new hire and compliance training. You'll need an LMS that lets you manage the rules and access for all your different learners and use cases.

What to Look For

- Ability to easily create dynamic learner groups for managing learning assignments, registrations, and more.
- A full suite of easy-to-use customization tools so you can configure every portal right down to the unique business rules that apply to each domain and learner.
- Automated administration and intuitive system workflows that free up admins to do more strategic work.
- Ability to define each course with the details it specifically needs, like prerequisites, continuing education credits, approvals, and more.
- Ability to manage and override default notifications at the course level.
- Support for your most complex use cases (have a few examples handy when you interview vendors to see if they have an easy solution or a complex workaround).




3. Easy Content Consumption

- Interactive elements, like quizzes and games, that can be easily added to existing videos and presentations.
- The platform supports any kind of content (vILT, YouTube, video, virtual reality, SCORM, AICC, xAPI, PDFs, Word docs, PPTs, and more.)
- Whether it's a knowledge object, video, quiz, or survey, they should all be launched seamlessly from one adaptive lightbox window within the LMS.
- Integrated video conferencing for one-click creation of virtual learning.
- Gamification features to create a culture of healthy competition with badges, awards, and leaderboards.

- Online, mobile checklists for instructors or mentors to observe and assess skills in person (such as during a CPR training session at a hospital) and record notes digitally.


5. Al Native Capabilities

- · One-stop access for managers to monitor, approve, or remind users of training.

- Advanced, native eCommerce functionality so you can easily manage commercial learning aspects such as providing a familiar shopping cart, multiple payment methods (including credit card, invoice, and training credits) and flexible subscription controls.

- Natural language input to get answers to questions like "Which managers have employees registered in training next month?"
- Drag-and-drop report creation tool for instantly creating custom reports of any design or complexity.
- BI integration so you can share learning data out to your organization's data infrastructure and bring back key organizational insights that drive learning strategies.
- Dedicated compliance analytics in a mobile app that lets admins and managers run reports on-the-go and get real-time statistics to ensure learners stay compliant.
- Report scheduling that automatically runs reports and sends email notifications at a set day, time, or intervals.
